ESCHATOLOGY.

DEFINITION.

§ 174. Eschatology is the doctrine of Holy Scripture concerning the end of temporal life, the second advent of Christ, the resurrection of the dead, final judgment, the consummation of all things, the everlasting damnation of the wicked, and the eternal bliss of the just in the world to come.

TEMPORAL DEATH.

§ 175. Temporal death is the termination of man's temporal life by the separation of his immortal soul² from his mortal body.³

Luke 12, 20: But God said unto him, Thou fool, this night thy soul shall be required of thee.

2 Tim. 4, 6: I am now ready to be offered, and the time of my departure is at hand.

Phil. 1, 23: I am in a strait betwixt two, having a desire to

depart and to be with Christ, which is far better.

2 Cor. 5, 1. 4. 8: We know that if our earthly house of this tabernacle were dissolved, we have a building of God, an house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens. (4) For we that are in this tabernacle do groan, being burdened: not for that we would be unclothed, but clothed upon, that mortality might be swallowed up of life. (8) We are confident, I say, and willing rather to be absent from the body, and to be present with the Lord.

2.

Matt. 10, 28: Fear not them which kill the body, but are not able to kill the soul.

Matt. 22, 32: I am the God of Abraham, and the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob. God is not the God of the dead, but of the living.

3

Rom. 8, 11: He that raised up Christ from the dead shall also quicken your mortal bodies.

1 Cor. 15, 35: But some man will say, How are the dead raised up?

DEATH OF THE WICKED.

§ 176. The temporal death of the wicked is a consequence and punishment of sin, and the transition of the soul spiritually dead into eternal death.

Rom. 5, 12: By one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin; and so death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned.

Rom. 5, 17: By one man's offense death reigned by one.

Rom. 5, 21: Sin hath reigned unto death.

Rom. 6, 23: The wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life.

Ezek. 18, 20. 26: The soul that sinneth, it shall die. The son

shall not bear the iniquity of the father, neither shall the father bear the iniquity of the son. (26) For his iniquity that he hath done shall he die.

Ezek. 33, 18: When the righteous turneth from his righteousness, and committeth iniquity, he shall even die thereby.

1 Pet. 3, 19. 20: By which also He went and preached unto the spirits in prison, which sometime were disobedient, when once the longsuffering of God waited in the days of Noah.

DEATH OF BELIEVERS.

§ 177. Though the temporal death of believers is also a consequence of sin,¹ it is no longer a punishment of sin,² but rather the cessation from sinning,³ and a transition from a spiritual life of faith and hope⁴ into an eternal life of perfect bliss with God.⁵

THE LAST GENERATION.

§ 178. Temporal death is not the future lot of all markind, inasmuch as a generation of men will live to witness the second coming of Christ.²

SIGNS OF THE LAST TIMES.

§ 179. The predicted second visible advent of Christ may be expected at any time, since all the signs which are to remind us of His coming have been fulfilled or are still in process of fulfillment, Antichrist is come and has been revealed in the Roman pontiff, and the last times are doubtless upon the world.

1 Cor. 1, 7: So that ye come behind in no gift, waiting for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Tit. 2, 13: Looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Savior Jesus Christ.

Rev. 1, 7: Behold, He cometh with clouds; and every eye shall see Him, and they also which pierced Him.

John 19, 37: And again another scripture saith, They shall look on Him whom they pierced.

Matt. 24, 14. 34: And this Gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in all the world for a witness unto all nations; and then shall the end come. (34) Verily, I say unto you, This generation shall not pass, till all these things be fulfilled.

And for this cause God shall send them strong delusion, that they should believe a lie.

§ 180. The purpose of the second coming of Christ is not the establishment of a millennial kingdom on earth, but the resurrection of all the dead, the final judgment, and the consummation of all things.

RESURRECTION OF ALL THE DEAD.

§ 181. The first act of Christ on His second advent and of the Holy Trinity, at the last day, will be the quickening or resuscitation of all the dead, whose souls will then be reunited with the same bodies from which they were separated in temporal death, but which will be adapted to a future state, those of the wicked to a state of everlasting shame and torment, those of the righteous to an everlasting state of celestial glory.

FINAL JUDGMENT.

§ 182. After the resurrection of all the dead,¹ and the range of those who shall have lived to see the second advent Christ,² all nations shall be gathered before Him,³ and e will separate the righteous from the wicked,⁴ and will, public judgment,⁵ by the testimony of their works,⁶ the od works² of the righteous in evidence of their faith,⁶ and

the evil works of the wicked⁹ in evidence of their unbelief, reveal to angels and men¹⁰ the righteousness of His judgment¹¹ and of the final sentence pronounced by God through Jesus Christ,¹² which will be just damnation to everlasting punishment for the wicked ¹³ and gracious assignment to life everlasting for the righteous.¹⁴

§ 185. The state of the elect, after the consummation, will be a state of eternal life¹ with God² and His angels³ in glory⁴ and bliss⁵ of body and soul⁶ unmarred by sin,⁻ pain,³ death,⁰ or the possibility of apostasy;¹⁰ and while the bliss of all the heirs of salvation¹¹ will be perfect¹² and their glory great,¹³ there will be degrees of glory,¹⁴ as God will graciously reward¹⁵ in the kingdom of glory¹⁶ the works performed by those who were faithful stewards¹¬ in the kingdom of grace. Then shall the glory of the righteous redound to the glory of Him to whose cross we shall owe our crowns and whom with immortal lips we shall forever praise, our Savior and our God.¹8·
