3. What are similarities between the conceptions, births, and lives of Isaac and Jesus? (Genesis 12–22)
4. Underline in your Bibles those places where Matthew records that Jesus called God "Father."
5. Note the differences in the uses of "Father."
6. What happened in 1 Samuel 4 when the Jews thought that they could "manipulate" God to help them?

Chapter III

Jesus Versus Satan: Who Will Win?

1. Read God's command and prohibition in Genesis 2:16f. and the Serpent's and Eve's interpretation of this passage in Genesis 3:1–3.
2. What are the differences between God's Word and the interpretation by Satan and Eve?
3. How is Genesis 3:1–3 similar to Matthew 4:6?
4. Read the parables in Matthew 13 and list the names that Jesus uses for the devil.
5. What name is used in Matthew 16: 23?
6. Why does Jesus severely scold Peter? (Matthew 16:21–23)
7. Read two sections on Baal from the Old Testament. (Numbers 25 and 1 Kings 18) What is the attitude of God towards the worship of other "gods"?
8. What is St. Paul's position on this matter? (1 Corinthians 8 :4–6)
9. Read Revelation 12:7–12 for more information about Satan.
 - a. What four names is he called?
 - b. What do his names tell us about him?
 - c. How is Satan conquered?
 - d. Also compare Matthew 4 and Ephesians 6:10–17.
10. The Apostles Creed says: "He descended into hell." By using Matthew 12:22–30; Colossians 2:15; and 1 Peter 3:19, tell what is involved in the conquest of Satan by Jesus.
11. Discuss demon possession in the Bible and in our day.
12. Are there any parallels between demon possession in the Gospels and for example the book, The Exorcist?

6. Compare Matthew 11:20–24 and Genesis 19:24f.
7. How does Jesus describe hell in the parables? (Matthew 13)
8. How is John 11:50 true in two different ways?
What did Caiaphas mean?
What did God mean?
9. How does Acts 2:23 hold God and the Jews "responsible" for the death of Jesus?
10. Read Matthew 16:21, 17:22f., 20:1Bf., and 20:28. According to these passages discuss the question of whether the death of Jesus was just a chance accident of history, unknown fate, or His own will.
11. Compare also Matthew 26:24. What does this say about the question for the responsibility for the death of Jesus?
12. Jesus prays His Father to remove the cup. (Matthew 26:36–46)

How does Matthew use the term blood in these cases?
 21. How does Leviticus 24:18 help us understand Matthew 20:28?
 22. Discuss the Roman form of execution by crucifixion.
 - a. How was it done?
 - b. What was the ultimate cause of death?
 - c. How long did the victims last in this condition?
 - d. Why did the Romans use this form of execution?
 23. Compare Isaiah 53:5 with Matthew 20:19 and 27:26 in the matter of the scourging.

Chapter V

King Jesus

1. 1 Samuel 7 is the first chapter in the Old Testament to present God's future Deliverer as a King or a Messiah. Messiah originally in the Old Testament means the king.

What does the prophet Nathan say about David's royal kingdom, house, and throne in this chapter? (vv. 13, 16, 26, 27, and 29) Compare Psalm 45:6; Hebrews 1:8, and Luke 1:32.

2. What is the great problem in 1 Samuel 8, especially vv. 7 and 10? How is this problem solved in 2 Samuel 7.
3. Who was really the King in Israel according to Psalm 95:3 and Psalm 98:4 and 6? Compare the words of Jesus in Matthew 5:35.
4. What is Jesus called in Matthew 2:3; 27:29; and 27:39?
5. Who is the only king who is specifically called a king in the royal genealogy? (Matthew 1:1–14)
6. Find four places in Matthew 27 where Jesus is called the king.
7. What role does Solomon play in the Gospel of Matthew? Compare the genealogy. (Matthew 1:1–14; 6:29; and 12:42)
8. What is the relationship between the Old Testament book The Song of Solomon and the Parable of the Marriage Feast? (Matthew 22 :1–10)

Chapter VI

The King and His Kingdom

1. How does membership in the kingdom of Jesus differ from the kingdom concept in the Old Testament? (Matthew 8:11–13)
2. Matthew 13 contains the parables of the kingdom.
 - a. How is the kingdom spread?
 - b. Who rules the kingdom?
 - c. Who belongs to the kingdom?

- d. What role does the kingdom have in the life of the kingdom member?
3. Matthew 25 contains parables of the future revelation of the kingdom in glory. What happens at that time?

Chapter VII

The Son of Man: Another Strange Title

3. Where in the Sermon on the Mount does Jesus refer to Moses and the laws given through Moses? (Matthew 5, 6, and 7)
4. How is the institution of the Lord's Supper by Jesus similar to acts performed by Moses?
5. In comparing Jesus to Jonah what are the similarities and dissimilarities between them? Read the Book of Jonah.
6. Where in the parables, Matthew 13, does Jesus specifically preach about Himself?

Chapter IX

Resurrection: The Finale
